These agencies are the UK Medicines and Healthcare Products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) and the European Medicines Agency (EMA).		
<b>Type of sources covered: Summaries of product characteristics.</b> An SPC tells healthcare professionals, such as doctors, pharmacists and nurses, how to prescribe and use a medicine correctly. An SPC is based on clinical trials that a pharmaceutical company has carried out, and gives information about dose, use and possible side effects.		
<b>Patient information leaflets:</b> A PIL is the leaflet that is included in the pack with a medicine. The PIL is a summary of the SPC and is written for patients. The eMC website is managed and owned by Datapharm Communications Limited, known as Datapharm. They work with pharmaceutical companies, the NHS, and other healthcare organisations to provide good information about medicines.

**Appendix 4** Search Discovery Tools**Go Pubmed** <http://www.gopubmed.org/web/gopubmed/>

GoPubMed<sup>®</sup> allows users to find information significantly faster and guarantees completeness of search results. The fundamental difference between GoPubMed's<sup>®</sup> semantic search technology and traditional search engines such as PubMed or Google is the use of background knowledge. Semantic algorithms connect text – abstracts from the MEDLINE database – to background knowledge in the form of semantic networks of concept categories, also called ontologies or knowledge base. This is done by **meaning** and **not** by **keywords** only. So results are meaningfully structured and intelligent semantic navigation becomes possible. You can also view publication statistics based on your search terms including top years published, countries, cities, authors, journals, subject terms.

Paste in a block of text and generate a list of relevant MeSH terms.

**Pubmed PubReMiner** - <http://hgserver2.amc.nl/cgi-bin/miner/miner2.cgi>

Provides detailed analysis of Pubmed Search results. Generates frequency tables to show which journals you topic is published in the most, which authors are most active, which words appear most in the titles and abstracts, which MeSH terms appear most frequently.

**Quetzal – Linguistic searching of Medline** <https://www.quetzal-search.info/>

Uses ontology based searching of Medline to deliver contextually relevant results. Quetzal's *Power Term*<sup>™</sup> functionality allows users to find all members of a category such as "diseases" without cluttering results with hits from general terms (e.g., disease, syndrome), resulting in lists that specifically answer questions such as: "Which diseases are affected by caffeine?". Subscription required.

**SJR SCImago Journal & Country Rank** <http://www.scimagojr.com/index.php> A portal that includes the journals and country scientific indicators developed from the information contained in the [Scopus](https://www.scopus.com/)<sup>®</sup> database. It includes the Shape of Science which visually illustrates the bibliometric data.

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Notes: Although aimed at people conducting literature searches for Health Technology Assessments, the above contains a wealth of useful information about search strategies and specialist information resources.

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
