Including items from NSPCC's CASPAR bulletin

The NSPCC has published the final **evaluation report of the Coping with Crying programme, a short film which aims to show parents coping strategies they can use with a crying baby** and explain the dangers of roughly handling an infant. Key findings include: evidence suggests that during times of stress parents who had watched the film were reacting in a positive way to their infant crying and were seeking help when it was necessary.

The Department for Education has published **Alan Wood's review of the role and functions of local safeguarding children's boards**. It sets out a new framework for improving the organisation and delivery of multi-agency arrangements to protect and safeguard children. Recommendations include: discontinuing serious case reviews and establishing an independent body at national level to oversee a national learning framework for inquiries into child deaths and cases where children have experienced serious harm.

Terminology guidelines for the protection of children from sexual exploitation and abuse

Plan International reports that the Interagency Working Group on Sexual Exploitation of Children has published terminology guidelines for the protection of children from sexual exploitation (CSE) and child sexual abuse (CSA). Also known as the Luxembourg Guidelines, these aim to strengthen collaboration and make responses to CSE and CSA more effective, by providing individuals and agencies with guidance for the understanding and use of the different terms and concepts they may encounter in their work.

Serious case review

Cumbria Local Safeguarding Children Board has published the report of a serious case review into the death of a 13 month old child. Key issues include: there were no plans put in place for any long term support to ensure that the family were thriving, despite the fact that there were significant indicators that the mother's capacity to parent may have been compromised by her own childhood experiences of trauma and abuse. Recommendations include: the use of family history, chronology and genealogy to identify patterns of risk should be promoted through multi-agency partnerships and utilised at the earliest opportunity.


