Child and adolescent mental health pilots

Children and Young People Now reports on 6 pilots being carried out in the West Midlands, South London, Thames Valley & Wessex, South West, West London and the North East & North Yorkshire to find out the best ways to cut the number of hospital admissions among children and young people with serious mental health problems. Two of these will focus on preventing hospital admissions by improving local crisis support, and the remaining four will aim to relocate young people currently in out-of-area secure mental health facilities back to their local community.
