Child to parent abuse

Community Care looks at parent abuse, discussing effects on families and possible causes. Key points include: child to parent abuse can be caused by trauma/stress, mental health issues, autism spectrum disorders, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and foetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD); it is not simply a parenting fault; unless it is tackled, it can manifest in a child becoming abusive in adulthood.
